Duration

Training content

This audio-visual supported training will allow participants to acquire the knowledge required by the international and national Regulations on transportation of dangerous goods. During the training, the participants are encouraged to ask questions. Exercises on the classification of dangerous goods, marking and labelling and shipping documents, among others, will be done during the training. Following each day's training, the attendee must complete a questionnaire to evaluate the knowledge acquired. This questionnaire will be returned to their employer as well as a wall certificate and wallet size certificate.
